## Discussion

- **Chairperson** Mary Cutts resigning as CDG chairperson. CDG thanked Mary C for her time in post. John Simmonds was the only one to stand to take over the position. This was agreed by all members of the CDG present.
- **Club/ Peer Paddles** Following from 2x incidents regarding members feeling they have not been lead effectively and a generally feeling that the club needs to be clearer what each of these mean.
  - John S has contacted British Canoeing (BC) regarding the definitions and differentiation between club and Peer Paddles. Spoke to Chris Earle (Head of Participation and Club Services) and Stephanie Roberts (Membership & Data Officer). A club activity needs risk assessments, and someone taking charge if the activity, whereas a peer paddle is for independent paddlers, where paddlers aren't coached or guided.
  - The club has a duty of care to keep members safe while they are on trips organised and run by the club. Juniors the club has a complete duty of care and therefore peer paddles may not be suitable, unless a coach or leader is happy to take responsibility for the safety of the junior.
  - Risk Assessments are needed for all club activities, Mary C suggested doing a generic risk assessment for each discipline and making sure coaches and leaders are dynamically risk assessing the water conditions, environment and ability of the group on the day. Beginner course RA already completed Mary C to send to all CDG.
  - Peer Paddles must have a description on the trip/ paddle information to make it clear that it is a peer paddle, without any coaching/ leadership. And that paddlers must be able to assess that they are competent to be paddling on the trip. *Mark*. *C* to write up a note for the bottom of all peer paddles.
  - Wednesday/ Sunday Regular Club Paddles It was agreed that some members have the



experience to treat these as peer paddles, where others did not. And that yet again it was discussed that there should be a coach/ leader rota to ensure those members who aren't ready for peer paddles or were a junior can come paddling in a safe environment. This rota could be equally staffed by experienced members, not just coaches. Rob D mentioned the BC Paddlesport Activity Assistant may meet the clubs needs in this respect. **John S.** to organise a rota

## • Experience Levels/ Categories of Activities -

- It was discussed that giving members a set experience level would be difficult to manage. Mary C suggested a traffic light method used at Adur Canoe Club, but again it was felt that with 200+ members this would be difficult to manage.
- The CDG felt it would be necessary to be more specific about experience level in calendar descriptions, and this would be subject to change if conditions worsened.
- Colour Coding on the calendar was discussed. Mark C to look into.
- Annie asked if the Next Step Paddles could be signed up via the website rather than through e-mail. Agreed.
- The CDG agreed that only peer paddles should be put on the Maidstone Canoe Club Paddlers FB group.
- During the winter Wednesday nights should be peer paddling only.
- **Club Consultation Document** Only Q9 is relevant to the CDG, John S is going to write a reply.
- Juniors there was a question on how the junior system was working, as most of the coaches don't attend regular club paddles. John S. to ask the committee

### Equipment

- Paddles Mark H. requested some slightly longer paddles for sea kayaks/ touring boats
- **Airbags** Mary C, wanted to make sure all boats we take beginner out in have air bags. And do we have a stock of spares?

### AOB -

**Mark C** - Wanted to understand how a racing session should work with 2 juniors, he took some out and worked between the 2 bridges. Bryn said the experienced paddler should always have sight of the people being coached.

### Peer Coaching

- Mark C ran a WW rope session which was well received and very useful.
- Bryn P happy to run a session in K2's
- Peer Coaching to continue once it becomes lighter in the evenings.
