VERY IMPORTANT MESSAGE for those storing boats at the club.

We are still very limited in the amount of boat storage available to club members; this will improve considerably when we are able to complete the new storage area but due to circumstances this is still some way off. There are quite a few boats in our current stores that are not paid for and some where we don't know the owners. This is not fair on



those who have paid and those who are waiting for a boat rack. The committee has decided that **all** private boats must display a private boat label like this with your name in waterproof marker. If you already have one of these on your boat(s) please ensure that your name is on there. If you need a label(s) please email Geoff <u>memsec@maidstonecanoeclub.net</u> stating the number you require, and they will be posted. Later this month we will be doing an audit of the boat stores and any boat found without a private boat label and name that is not a club boat will be photographed and displayed on the club's website in an attempt to find the owner. A decision will be made about what will happen to boats that are not claimed.

On May 17<sup>th</sup> there should be an announcement regarding changes to Lockdown. From the information we currently have the only change will be that we can paddle in bigger groups.

Face coverings must still be worn in the Club Buildings and social distance observed. The token system will remain in place for changing rooms, the gym can be used by 3 people max with the windows and doors open. Still NO showers.
