All these are made possible due to the Coaching Developing Group (CDG) which sits separately to the committee allowing to be successful and is very different to the format of other clubs as this gives a real depth to the canoeing instruction offered at Maidstone. This year the CDG have continued to encourage and train new PAAs/PIs/Leaders and coaches

MCC have had work parties to get the 'dive club' ready

<u>Junior club</u> - continues to be very successful and runs on a Tuesday evening from Spring through to Summer. There is now a good core group of younger/junior members who are now looking to progress in the sport

The Chairman's aim for this year coming is:

- 1) the New Build which is now happening
 - ◆ Planning and Building Regs on 7th March 2023 got full planning permission through
 - It is a priority for this year
- 2) Progression in the club of over 280 members it is important for retention and to maintain the club's finances it is important to keep 100 membership
 - ◆ This is achieved by maintaining and improving progression of our paddlers and to get better we need to get the instructors now to also progress e.g. WW/Sea Kayaking/Racing
- 3) Website update the current Website is of a high level and had been amazing but can be improved and is being revamped
- 4) To add another racing event within the calendar and therefore keeping MCC on the racing calendar. This year MCC were approached to see if they are interested in running a race event to be included within the Flat Water Winter Series due to the facilities here at Maidstone

John also stated that this year he hopes to be his last year as Chairman and that next year it is important that someone else takes on the task. A Club as big as MCC needs to have new people running it so as to get new ideas etc

And finally from the chairman — life is short — set yourself one new paddling goal this year paddling wise e.g. try out the K- boats

Treasurer & Membership Secretary's report:

A big thank you to John Simmonds for all his hard work over the year

- ➤ Membership a record year 285 as per all previous years we lose about 60/70 members. But each year we are gaining more than we are losing
 - British Canoeing consider MCC to be a pretty well organised club
- Catherine Dacey successfully bid for a 'She paddles Grant' and British Canoeing states that we need more photos of women paddling on our Website
- Currently the proportion of women in the club is 35% but this differs within the different age categories and is bigger within the younger cohort

Statement of Accounts:

Income

- Subscriptions increased
- ➤ Boat storage constant
- ➤ Beginners course continues to be a good revenue source thank you to Mark Corti and coaches for doing this
 - Pool Sessions run at a small profit
 - ➤ Marathon run at a profit

Expenditure

- ➤ Coaching courses supporting coaches with part payments so as to invest in our future
- > She Paddle grant matched by club as a condition of receiving this
- Fees building cost mostly as did not need to buy many boats this year
- ➤ Rent for 'dive club' This was for 2 years worth as MBC kept sending £0 invoices and finally caught up with this despite them having been chased
- > Thanks to Paul C for the auditing of the accounts

Accepting of the accounts – proposed by Jon Lock, Seconded by Bryn Price AGREED by the meeting

Membership – projections shown for different fees and how this will affect the income to the club

- ➤ Committee agreed not to increase boat storage for the year due to the increased capacity that the New Build will give the membership
- ➤ Committee suggested a 6% increase to fees to accommodate ongoing costs and increases
- Discussion held by AGM on differing amounts
- > An increase of 7-8% (£90 for adult membership) was proposed

Proposed by Anj Hill and Seconded by Reece Nelms AGREED by AGM

Racing Team Report (Bryn Price):

- A great year
- Racing are a small part of MCC but are doing very well

- Jan 2022 Inese Buzzin competed in her first race which was a 20km race and was promoted
- May 2022 the Hasler was run and many novices took part
- The age of the racing group is lowering such as Joel Crampton reaching Div 4 whilst still under 18
- Aaron and Leanne Jordon continue to do really well
- There are good partnership within the Masters with other clubs:
 - Catherine with Kerstin from BSF
 - Bryn and lain
- MCC was present at the European Master's Marathon Championships in Denmark
- MCC were present at the World Master's Marathon Championships in Portugal where they achieved great results
- However MCC need more youngsters and Bryn will be running Kent Police Cadet Training programmes from Easter with the hope of having the youngster race in the Maidstone Hasler this year

New Build update (John Simmonds):

- Process dragged out partly due to Covid
- Had to wait for planning which originally had been told not necessary
- Work party occurs every fortnight starts again on 18th March 2023 and more help always welcomed
- Will be completed in 2 phases:
 - Phase 1 boat storage area involves cutting a doorway; putting in doors; boat racking (should be ready by next month)
 - Phase 2 changing rooms; storage etc.

Mid-Kent College have offered to build this for us

- MCC to provide the materials
- It is a community project which is what Mid-Kent's remit is for its training schemes
- Any MCC members with the necessary skills who can and want to offer their time please contact the chairman
- Mid-Kent may joint up with West Kent which means further skills so may be able to complete to further remits of the build

Boat Storage – 2 types available:

<u>Vertical</u> – Uses dead space; but difficult for man handling the boats; more clubs going over to this <u>Horizontal</u> – Limited by height

To start with there will be both and members will be asked to use and test both. A decision can then be made on the feedback from the members as to which works best before deciding which to go with

Remit is for boats upto 3m long and to be accessible to all

Geoff O thanked everyone who cleaned the ceiling which had 30 years worth of grease on it!

Committee Awards

- Young Paddler Violet Pond She has blossomed in her paddling progressing throughout the year and has achieved the explorer award
- Newcomer of the year Tom Payne puts in a lot of effort in the club quietly always picking
 up litter on and off the water and has introduced Yoga to the club running sessions for club
 members
- Racer of the year Paul Lane was determined to get fitter and better. Goes on his own to races and travel virtually anywhere just to improve
- Recreational paddler of the year Matt Clegg progressed massively in this year. Taken to canoeing and became part of their life and has aced grade 3&4 WW
- <u>Chairman Award</u> Alan Nevard Put a lot into the club this year instructing and running courses and trips and quietly doing stuff. And even taken part in marathon paddling and looking to progress into sea kayaking coaching enjoyed themselves
