Geoff presented the accounts and reported the following:

- The club's finances are healthy and we are in a good position for developing the club.
- Membership is slightly below last year but is still strong.
- The committee proposed keeping membership the same as last year and this was voted on and agreed.
- The committee proposed raising the price of boat storage. There was much discussion about this. Bill Norman proposed raising the fee to £52 for the year per boat, which works out to £1 each week. Geoff Orford suggested £50 per boat for the coming year. This was voted on. For: 21/22 Against 1/22.

Update on building plans: Bryn Price

Bryn gave the following update on the proposed expansion of the club:

- The proposed building would be to create additional boat storage on the ground level with an additional room above. Downstairs storage is likely to be used for housing generalpurpose boats standing upright. Usage for the second floor would be given thorough consideration and members are encouraged to propose ideas if planning is granted and funding gained.
- The process has been long and plans have had to be resubmitted. Bryn has had to provide



- additional documentation with regard to flood risk etc. Regarding flood risk the environment agency has given Bryn a lot of help. Hopefully we will have a response within two months.
- Detailed budgets will have to be put together before applying for grants for capital expenditure. Bryn has already identified four possible grant providers. The club received encouragement to expand from Canoe England and our local Sports Minister Tracey Crouch.

Thank you to Bryn for all his hard work in moving the club's proposals forward.

President's Award

Brian read Paul's presentation to the recipient of this year's President's Award. In this award Paul wants to promote a reward that would be the antithesis of a "Victor Ludorum" style, a very real valuing of performance, club loyalty, hard work on behalf of the club and those values which contribute to a thriving, happy and successful club.

This year's recipient has been known to Paul Newman since they were teenagers and Paul feels this recipient has exceeded all the above criteria. Paul wished he had been at the meeting to remedy his previous gross oversight by presenting this trophy in person. This year's recipient is Mick Wibrew. Following their initial meeting and Mick's introduction to canoeing in The Scouts, Mick has gone on to be a seriously experienced paddler. Although known mainly for his marathon pursuits, Mick is also a veteran sea and white water paddler. One of his most impressive achievements is becoming a member of the exclusive "DW 1000 Mile Club" in 1988. However Mick continued to enter the DW long beyond 1988 and was twice a member of the DW winning team of three boats, and placed second overall in an individual boat. Mick is a well-known racer at the National Championships and represented MCC at the World Masters Games in Melbourne, Australia in 2002.

Mick has sat on the club's committee for a number of years, contributing sensible and considered advice and help. He is always willing to assist with coaching youngsters in linear boats, giving advice and safety cover.

The description "LEGEND" is often bandied around, but Mick Wibrew is a deserving recipient of the President's Trophy and is truly a "Legend in his own bathtime".
